<u>Future of Diplomacy discussed at Munich Security Conference</u> (MSC), February 14-16, Munich (Germany)

During a 16 February townhall session on the future of diplomacy, CTBTO Executive Secretary Lassina Zerbo heralded the importance of science diplomacy. He argued that science is a sphere where one easily finds a common

denominator -- it cuts across boundaries. The Comprehensive Nuclear-Test-Ban Treaty (CTBT) is a prime example of great scientific cooperation to monitor against nuclear testing, said Dr. Zerbo.



<u>Strengthening the NPT regime: priorities for the 2020 NPT</u> <u>RevCon</u>, March 4-5, Accra (Ghana)

Dr. Zerbo attended a conference in Accra that brought together senior officials, practitioners and technical experts from governments, regional organizations and thinks tanks to discuss the state of play in advance of the 2020 NPT RevCon from an African perspective.

CYGs discussed how the African Youth can be involved in the Nuclear Avenue and serve as the driving force behind this area. The CYGs stressed the importance of coupling both science and policy and having university programs that give an insight of the two. They made a recommendation of having an African Delegation to the NPT RevCon and also being included in the African Union body that deals with nuclear matters (AFCONE).

<u>Presentation Contest at MEPhI</u> <u>University</u>, March 12, Moscow (Russia)

On March 12, MEPhI hosted the Presentation Contest "My vision of the CTBT 2026" which brought together students from different profiles to show the passion for what the CTBTO is doing. The participants from Russia, India, Kenya, Togo and Sri Lanka shared their crossdomain initiatives and ideas on how to strengthen the role of the CYG and elevate the visibility of the Treaty.
